<u>Sea Grant Career Opportunities:</u> Sea Grant has several job openings across the country, including new positions in Maine focused on lobster and on aquaculture and a new position in Maryland focused on aquaculture.

<u>Apply for the Margaret A. Davidson Graduate Fellowship</u> This new fellowship program will place graduate students at the national estuarine research reserves. One two-year fellowship opportunity will be available at each of the 29 coastal sites. Applications are due December 20, 2019.

NOAA Environmental Literacy Program Funding Opportunity The NOAA Office of Education has issued a competitive funding opportunity for projects designed to build environmental literacy of K-12 students and the public so they are knowledgeable of the ways in which their community can become more resilient to extreme weather and/or other environmental hazards, and become involved in achieving that resilience. The first deadline is November 25, 2019.

NOAA Heritage Program is now accepting funding proposals for projects within NOAA that will help preserve, protect and promote the agency's heritage. For FY20, the NOAA Heritage Program will award a total of \$100,000 to NOAA employees for these projects. NOAA employees who apply may partner with other federal, state, tribal, Native Hawaiian, academic and non-profit organizations on the proposals.
