Sea Grant Programs Receive NOAA Funding for Climate Science, Community Resilience



NOAA's Climate Program Office recently announced \$171 million in awards for new climate research. These awards include support for projects involving Sea Grant programs through the Regional Integrated Sciences and Assessments (RISA) program.

RISA is funding <u>five-year teams</u> that will build sustained relationships between decision-makers and researchers to support collaborative and equitable adaptation to climate risks. The teams include:

- Alaska Center for Climate Assessment and Policy, ACCAP (with involvement from Alaska Sea Grant),
- Carolinas Collaborative on Climate, Health, and Equity, C3HE (with involvement from North Carolina Sea Grant),
- The Northwest Climate Resilience Collaborative, NCRC (with involvement from Washington Sea Grant),
- Pacific Regional Integrated Sciences and Assessments, Pacific RISA (with involvement from Hawai'i Sea Grant), and
- Southern Climate Impacts Planning Program, SCIPP (with involvement from Texas Sea Grant & Louisiana Sea Grant).

Additionally, RISA is funding a <u>1-year project</u> with Florida, Georgia, Mississippi-Alabama and Puerto Rico Sea Grant programs to launch <u>the Southeast and Caribbean Climate Alliance</u>. The project will provide a better understanding of racial, socioeconomic, and structural disparities that could plausibly be linked to the health outcomes of climate change; and develop a shared vision and research framework required to promote health, equity, and estimate corresponding resource needs.

Illinois-Indiana Sea Grant Faculty Scholars Experiment with Sustainable Concrete Solutions

Two Illinois-Indiana Sea Grant faculty scholars explored different ideas that might help make concrete more environmentally friendly. Both projects looked at sources for replacing aggregate, the material frequently placed under concrete to clean and store water. Aggregate is becoming a scarce resource in many cities and needs to be hauled from longer distances, increasing the cost and the carbon footprint.

This November, join Sea Grant for two virtual, professional development workshops at the CERF 2021 conference:



In 2020, a federal investment in Sea Grant of \$87 million resulted in \$519.5 million in economic benefit. Funding and Career Opportunities

<u>Sea Grant Career Opportunities</u> Sea Grant has several job openings across the country, such as Director of Oregon Sea Grant, Coordinator for the Coastal Neighbors Technical Assistance Program with New Hampshire Sea Grant, and Communications Program Manager with California Sea Grant.

<u>Aquaculture Research Funding Opportunities</u> Sea Grant has two open federal funding opportunities to advance U.S. aquaculture. Notices of intent to submit for Marine Finfish Aquaculture: Juvenile Production Technologies are due **November 9, 2021**. Notices of intent to submit for Early Stage Propagation Strategies for Aquaculture Species are due **November 16, 2021**.

<u>California Sea Grant Delta Independent Science Board Postdoctoral Scholars</u> The Delta Independent Science Board (Delta ISB) and California Sea Grant are seeking two postdoctoral scholars to support the Delta ISB with its legislative mandate to provide oversight of the scientific research, monitoring, and assessment programs that support adaptive management of Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. Applications will be reviewed starting on **November 29, 2021**, and will remain open until filled.

South Atlantic Red Snapper Program Funding Opportunity The South Carolina Sea Grant Consortium is seeking proposals that expand the current South Atlantic Red Snapper Research Program Project 1 to augment the data that will be used for management advice of Red Snapper in the South Atlantic. Proposals are welcomed from institutions of higher education and the proposal Principal Investigator(s) must be based within a Southeast U.S. state (NC, SC, GA, FL). Letters of intent are due by 5p ET on November 30, 2021.

<u>PLACE: SLR Fellowship</u> The Program for Local Adaptation to Climate Effects: Sea Level Rise (PLACE: SLR) seeks a fellow to work on-the-ground at the intersection of climate, flooding, health, and socioeconomic vulnerability, helping to understand and address gaps and needs for improved community resilience. The one-year fellowships begins January 1, 2022 and is open until filled.

NOAA Environmental Literacy Program Funding Opportunity The NOAA Office of Education has issued a competitive funding opportunity for projects that develop the collective environmental literacy necessary for communities to take actions that build resilience to extreme weather and climate change in ways that contribute to community health, social cohesion, and socio-economic equity. More information is available at the link above. For Priority 1, the deadline for pre-applications is 11:59 pm ET on November 1, 2021. For Priority 2, pre-applications are not required and the deadline for full applications is 11:59 pm ET on January 25, 2022.

<u>NOAA Public Comment Period on "America the Beautiful" Initiative</u> NOAA is currently seeking public comment to inform its actions to advance the goals and recommendations in the report on conserving and restoring America the Beautiful, including conserving at least 30 percent of U.S. lands and waters by 2030. Instructions on how to submit a comment, as well as the specific topics on which NOAA is seeking input, and information on how to join two virtual public listening sessions on **November 8** and **November 16**, <u>are available here</u>.

<u>NOAA Ocean Exploration Education Mini-Grants</u> NOAA Ocean Exploration in cooperation with the National Marine Sanctuary Foundation are accepting proposals for small grants intended to support Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility efforts that advance ocean literacy, stewardship, and workforce development related to ocean exploration. The deadline to submit proposals is **November 15, 2021**.

<u>NOAA Western Region Student Photo Contest</u> The NOAA Western Region has launched the "Picture Climate Change" student photo contest and is looking for images that showcase climate change in the western United States. Students in grades 5 through 12 may submit entries through **November 15, 2021**.

EPA Health and Climate Change/Environmental Justice Funding Opportunity The U.S. Environmental

Protection Agency (EPA), as part of its Science to Achieve Results program, is seeking applications proposing transdisciplinary research to analyze environmental problems at the intersection of climate change, environmental justice, and vulnerable populations and lifestages. <u>US Harbors Rising with the Tide Webinar</u> US Harbors is hosting a free conference to help coastal communities and their citizens understand and prepare for changes in coastal water levels, including king tides, storm surges, and sea level rise. Experts will be speaking on these key aspects of rising coastal water levels, including Mississippi-Alabama Sea Grant Consortium's Renee Collini. The event takes place 1-4p ET on **November 17, 2021**.

NOAA's Office for Coastal Management Margaret A. Davidson Graduate Fellowship The Margaret A. Davidson Graduate Fellowship is a two-year fellowship program that places one graduate student at each of the 29 national estuarine research reserves. Through a research project, fellows address a key reserve management need to help scientists and communities understand coastal challenges that may influence future policy and management strategies. Applications are due by December 10, 2021.

<u>NOAA Dr. Nancy Foster Scholarship Program</u> The NOAA Office of National Marine Sanctuaries is seeking applications for the Dr. Nancy Foster Scholarship Program from individuals, particularly women and minorities, who due to financial constraints, may not otherwise be able to pursue an advanced degree (Masters or Ph.D.) in oceanography, marine biology, and maritime archaeology. The deadline for applications is 11:59p ET on **December 14, 2021**.

<u>NIHHIS Urban Heat Island Mapping Campaign</u> The National Integrated Heat Health Information System (NIHHIS) and CAPA Strategies are now accepting applications from organizations interested in participating in the 2022 Urban Heat Island mapping campaigns. Interested cities should apply by 5p ET on January 14, 2022.

<u>NOAA Coastal Management and Digital Coast Fellowships</u> NOAA's Coastal Management and Digital Coast Fellowships offer postgraduate students on-the-job education and training opportunities in coastal resource management and policy. The application deadline for fellows to apply is **January 21, 2022**, and nominations from Sea Grant are due **February 18, 2022**.







UN Ocean Decade October 2021 Update In October 2021, the UN Ocean Decade endorsed ninety-four new Decade Actions and issued Call for Decade Actions No. 02/2021, the

second of the series that will focus on Decade programs that address priority issues including marine pollution, multiple stressors on marine ecosystems, or the ocean-climate nexus.
