

- It opens the door to submitting a full proposal
- If in doubt, **submit** something

- There are **few chances** to correct or



- Applications have a long list of parts, forms, and other elements
- Make sure you have **all** of those elements or the application **will not** be reviewed
- Double check everything

Check The Minimum Requirements



Tell Your Story 10

- You have limited space
- Provide requested context
- Focus on what you need the funding for
- Leave out things that are not relevant
- to the funding effort
- Make it easy to see how you are addressing the priorities
- Make sure you are addressing the evaluation criteria in your narrative



- Reviewers are humans, and often volunteers
- They know this field
- They are excited to learn about what you want to do
- Make their job easy give them what they need and nothing extra
- They can't give you credit for what isn't included

Brief discussion of the partnership, its approach, and its impact:

This project will occur in the region around Point Nemo (FIPS 0000000), a remote region that is deeply vulnerable to climate change. As you can see on the CEJST map to the right, Point Nemo is already completely submerged With a small, highly motivated population, Point Nemo will engage in a whole-community approach to building a climate ready workforce. This work will focus on the aquaculture, tourism, environmental engineering, and underwater habitat construction industry. We have engaged with the leading employers in each sector, who have specific skill needs to adapt their businesses and our community to climate-driven challenges. Trainees will learn about climate impacts to Point Nemo, and how it will impact their work.



🔄 . Census tracts are a small unit of geography. They generally have population: A of between 1.200 - 8.000 people.

Communities that are disadvantaged live in tracts that experience burdens. These tracts are highlighted O on the map.

The tool ranks most of the burdens using percentiles \triangle . Percentiles show how much burden each tract experiences when compared to other tracts.

Thresholds 单 , or cutoff are used to determine if communities in a tract are disadvantaged. Certain burdens use percentages d or a simple yes/no ✓

Land within the boundarie of Federally Recognized Tribes and point location for Alaska Native Villages are highlighted O on the map. These communitie are also considered disadvantaged.
