Community Engaged Internship Program for Undergraduates

Sea Grant's Community Engaged Internship (CEI) aims to broaden participation in coastal, ocean and marine sciences by offering paid internships to undergraduate students from under-resourced, underrepresented and/or indigenous and tribal populations. The CEI is a national program partnering with Sea Grant at colleges and universities in all coastal states.
